ACT FIRE & RESCUE COMMUNITY FIRE UNITS Auxiliary Member



ACT Fire & Rescue Community Fire Units (CFU) Auxiliary Members play a key role in assisting with the administrative tasks of running a unit. They are non-operational members and <u>must not</u> be present during fire ground activities.

Duties/Responsibilities

Typically, a CFU Auxiliary Member will perform duties including but not limited to:

- Assisting the Team Leader to maintain up to date records of membership and training.
- Maintaining contact with unit members throughout the year.
- Helping to prepare reports of compliance before each fire season.
- Participating in community engagement and education activities.

Minimum Requirements of Membership

- Must reside within the Units Recruitment Area.
- Must hold and maintain an unrestricted Working with Vulnerable People (WWVP) registration.
- Must be willing to support and uphold the ACT Emergency Services Agency (ESA) Volunteer Code of Conduct and ACT Public Service values and behaviours of: Respect, Integrity, Collaboration, Innovation, Trust, and Commitment.

- An effective communicator and listener.
- An ability to follow instructions.
- Informed of the CFU Objects and Functions.
- A working knowledge of the Emergencies Act 2004 as well as ACT Fire & Rescue Standards and Protocols for Community fire Units.
- Understanding of Primary Duty of Care and responsibilities of the individual in relation to the Work Health and Safety Act 2011.
- Commitment to working as part of a positive and supportive team.

- Current First Aid and CPR
- Asbestos Awareness
